Building accessibility

The Scottish Poetry Library aims to be as accessible as possible for all users.

We hope this information will be of help if you are planning to visit the library or borrow books through our postal borrowing system.

If you find you require any help during your visit, please tell us. If you would like someone to show you round the building on your first visit, we'll be happy to do so.

Building access

You do not need to negotiate any steps to get into the library. Please be aware there is a steep slope up from Holyrood Road, and a gentle slope down from Canongate. Cars can drop off visitors at the door of the library, by driving up Gentle's Entry Holyrood Road. The Canongate access is blocked to cars by a bollard.

There is a push pad which can be used to open the front door, but should you want to alert staff attention please call 0131 557 2876.

A lift connects all three levels of the building:

ground floor, where most of the collection is stored, Meeting Room 1 is and the reception desk is situated

mezzanine level, where most events are held and Meeting Room 2

basement, where a wheelchair-accessible toilet is situated next to the lift

The lift doors open to approximately 80cm wide. The narrowest space to negotiate is on the mezzanine level past the journal racks when they are moved to position during events – this is approximately 76-78cm wide.

Toilets

There are two gender neutral toilets in the Scottish Poetry Library. One is larger and more accessible:

- The toilet door opens to approximately 80cm.
- The transfer space is to the left and measures approximately 136cm wide.
- The height of the toilet is 40cm.
- There is a flip down handle at a height of 88cm when deployed, and a length of 75cm.
- The sink is at a height of 72cm.

• There is a baby change facility located inside this toilet.

For D/deaf users

There is a portable hearing loop which you can use when talking to staff or for events. Please ask a member of staff. It is a Geemarc LoopHear.

For blind and visually-impaired users

Parking

Crichton's Close parking restrictions (double yellow lines) do not allow parking at any time, although unloading is allowed. Blue badge holders may be able to park on the double yellow lines.

It is not possible to drive from the Canongate into Crichton's Close, although taxis are usually willing to stop on the Canongate beside Crichton's Close (next to Starbucks) to let passengers out. Taxis and other cars can also drive up to the close from Holyrood Road: ask the driver to find the Tun building on Holyrood Road, then turn up Gentle's Entry and turn right into Crichton's Close.

Public Transport

Lothian Buses service 35 stops on Canongate directly opposite Crichton's Close, the location of the Scottish Poetry Library. All Lothian buses are easy access. More information can be found here:

Postal Borrowing

You can then borrow by post, by emailing reception@spl.org.uk, calling 0131 557 2876 or writing to us with details of the item(s) you wish to borrow. The item is posted to you along with a Freepost label for its return.

Postal borrowing is available for free to disabled and D/deaf users. If you are entitled to this service, please let us know when you apply to become a borrower.
